## Message from the Head

Dear Parents/Carers,

It seems so long ago that we returned from our Christmas holiday.

I hope you all had a wonderful break and I want to wish a Happy New Year to you all.

As you know, this term is very short, with only one more week until half-term and another short 5-weeks until Easter. Just a reminder that children will return on **Tuesday 20th February 2018** as Monday 19th is designated as a staff training day.

It has been an extremely busy month for sports since returning from the Christmas break.

8 children from classes 4 and 5 took part in the HCAT dodgeball competition, achieving 2nd place overall! In addition, Bellfield entered 6 teams from classes 1 to 6 to represent us in Boccia. We are delighted to say that children in some of these teams returned to school with bronze, silver and gold medals.

Some of our class 6 boys took part in a football tournament and, despite the freezing weather and snow downpour, they persevered and showed good teamwork.

In school, classes 5 and 6 have been taking part in boxing as part of one of their P.E. sessions each week, with a coach from Hull Amateur Boxing Club. We have offered this experience a number of times now and the all of the children tell us how much they enjoy it.

Once again, thank you to our P.E. leader, Mrs Cowap for organising these events and to our sports leaders for supporting in running them.

## Visits

January has been a very busy month for children taking part in educational visits to enhance their learning.

## HCAT News



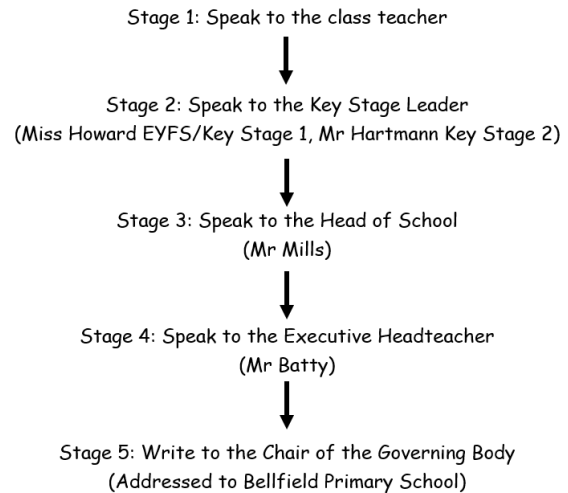
As you know, Bellfield is one of the four founding schools of Hull Collaborative Academy Trust (HCAT), which was formed in 2013. Since being established, it has grown to consist of 13 primary schools (Bellfield, Eastfield, Collingwood, Thoresby, Wansbeck, Westcott, Sutton Park, Dorchester, Wheeler, Gilberdyke, Stockwell, Longhill, Pearson) and 1 secondary school (The Marvel College). Being part of a Trust gives us many more opportunities and flexibility than we had as a Local Authority maintained school. Our children have many more opportunities to work alongside children from other Trust schools and take part in the many sporting competitions that the Trust organises each year. This week, the league tables for Academies was published by the DfE and I am immensely proud to report that HCAT was placed in the top ten Academies (out of 154 Academies across the country) for children's progress in reading, writing and maths. In addition, for all three together, HCAT is placed in the top 4! This is a significant achievement as HCAT continues to go from strength-to-strength, with the key aim of putting 'children first'.

## Concerns Flow Chart

We often have parents asking about who to go to if they have a concern. In order to clarify this, and to make the process clearer, we have put together a simple flowchart (right), which should help you get the answers and resolutions you need in the quickest time possible.
