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## Attendance

Just a reminder that if your child is going to be absent from school that you **MUST** contact the school office on the first morning of absence. You are able to leave a voice message if the office is busy. Please note that we do not authorise holidays during term time, unless they are under one of the following circumstances:

- 1) Service personnel who are prevented from taking holidays outside term-time (*Employees refused leave during school holiday, may not be referred for a fine at the Head Teachers discretion*)
- 2) Acute crisis within the family and the family needs to spend time together to support each other
- 3) Court order/formal agreement where parents have separate and have allocated dates for contact
- 4) If your child is 4 years old

## Reminder of Covid procedures

As we start to tentatively return to some normality, it is important that we continue to follow Government guidelines.

Many of you will have seen on the news how you are able to order your own Lateral Flow tests to use at home. As a school, we are **not able** to take these tests as an indicator that children/adults within your house are negative. Therefore, if anyone in your house has any of the following symptoms you **MUST** all isolate and book in for a PCR test at a recognised test centre.

- 1) **A new continuous cough**
- 2) **A high temperature**
- 3) **Loss or change of taste and or smell**

If you are in any doubt, please contact the school office who will be happy to help and **DO NOT** send your child, ask the school first. You can always bring your child later in the day if we advise that this is possible.

The isolation period remains at 10 days for everyone. (*This means the person with symptoms or a confirmed positive test and anyone else living in your house*). If you are concerned, please keep your child at home and ring the school office. They will advise you on what to do and when/if your child can come to school.

## SATS and Year 4 Multiplication Test

Our Year 2 and Year 6 children recently spent a week doing their SAT's tests. We were extremely proud of every child. They were **FANTASITIC** and did themselves proud.

Thank you for your support at home by encouraging them to do their best, have early nights and be at school on time; this really did help them to be ready and prepared.

Many of our Year 4 children took part in their Multiplication test last week – again, they all worked extremely hard and we were very proud of their efforts. Well done Year 4!

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## Transition week

We will be having two days whole school transition on Monday 12<sup>th</sup> and Tuesday 13<sup>th</sup> July. This will be an opportunity for children to get to know their new teacher.

Year 6 children will be completing their Design Technology project in the hall with Mr Newton for the two days. We are still waiting for full confirmation on the different transition activities that the Secondary Schools are providing. We will endeavour to do as many of these as possible. (Further information will follow, once we have confirmation)

We would like children to use their new entrances and exits for the transition days, as stated in a previous letter.

**Nursery children moving to Reception:** Enter through the side gate situated off the school field

**Reception children moving to Year 1:** Enter through the main gates (Please give hugs and kisses at the gate)

**Year 1 children moving to Year 2:** Enter through the main gates

**Year 2 children moving to Year 3:** Enter through the main gates and walk in through the hall door

**Year 3 children moving to Year 4:** Enter through the main gates and walk in through the hall door

**Year 4 children moving to Year 5:** Enter through the carpark gates and walk around the building and in through the back door

**Year 5 children moving to Year 6:** Enter through the carpark gates and walk around the building and in through the back door

Year 6 children to enter through the carpark gate and into the hall.

If your child is in Nursery and is either not joining our Reception Class or not yet old enough for school, they will come to Nursery as normal, but please for these two days use the side gate situated off the school field.

The teachers will walk the children through these changes before the transition day and show them their new classrooms.

## Staffing and Classroom changes

Over the summer holidays, we are having some building work and moving our classroom around in Key Stage 2. Our Year 5 and 6 children will now have the two classrooms at the end of the school and they are having a new 'common room' area being built over the summer holidays. Our big push next year is going to be on independence and preparing our older children for the next stage in their education journey. As such, our Year 5 and 6 children will have their own 'zone' of the school. A new common room will be there for them to use at break-time, lunchtime and eventually during breakfast club. They will have their own technology station, reading area, lounge and workspace. We are very excited to see the finished space and hope the children will gain more independence through using this area.

In addition to a new common area, our Year 5/6 children will be fortunate to be having their own 'Well-being Coach.' Mrs Lomax is our new coach and will be having regular 1:1 check-ins with all pupils, support any mental health needs, support children with transition to Secondary school, provide support and comfort when needed and work closely with Mrs Puckering in order to get to know our children and families.

We are very excited to be welcoming five new members of staff to the team in September. As restrictions remain in place until the last week, we will not be able to do our usual 'meet the teacher' sessions. Therefore, you will receive a video, on your Seesaw account, with a message from your child's new teaching team.
