* Teachers are to personalise the above to the needs of individual children in their class for children identified as having additional needs.

<u>First Aid</u>	<u>Intimate Care</u>	<u>Hugs</u>	<u>Asking to play with peers</u>
<p>First aiders are to ask children for consent prior administering first aid. For example - Am I ok to wipe your knee?</p> <p>The child could also be asked if they would like to help with the first aid when possible. For example - Would you like to wipe your knee or shall I?</p> <p>**</p>	<p>During intimate care, adults are to ask children first if they are ok to help them to gain consent. Along with individual intimate care plans and the EYFS nappy changing policy, all children are to complete their own intimate care as much as possible.</p>	<p>Children have the right to give or not give consent to physical contact they either like or don't like. Children are to know it is ok to say they don't want to be hugged.</p>	<p>Children are to ask each other age appropriate questions when it comes to playing. For example - Can I play with you? Would you like to play with me?</p>
<u>PE</u>	<u>Personal belongings</u>	<u>Photos on online platforms</u>	<u>Personal contact</u>
<p>All teachers and coaches are to gain children's permission prior to positioning children during lessons.</p>	<p>Asking for consent when touching children's belongings. Both children and adults are to ask others prior to moving personal belongings. For example, cloakrooms monitors could inform the full class before going to complete their role.</p>	<p><i>(Parents already give consent, when the children join the school, in relation to online platforms.)</i></p> <p>Children are also to ask their peers when taking photos for their own SeeSaw and projects.</p>	<p>Asking for consent from children prior to personal contact. For example, holding hands and doing children's hair.</p>
