Communication and language	Understand 'why' questions, like: "Why do you think the caterpillar got so fat?" Use a wider range of vocabulary	Adult led questioning about what children might notice within stories or their environments. For example, 'Why is the moon out? What does this tell you?', 'Why did the Caterpillar have a stomach ache?'	Possible story - The Very Hungry Caterpillar Story Sack 'Can you talk about the story with a friend using the props?'
Personal Social Development	Be increasingly independent in meeting their own care needs. Make healthy choices about food, drink, activity and tooth brushing. Know about healthy choices for their body	Sorting activity— Children to sort food and drink into healthy, unhealthy and 'just a little of'. Adult to offer questions to further children's understanding. E.g. 'What would happen if I ate too much chocolate?'	Dentist Roleplay Gym Roleplay Story - The Large Family A piece of cake

Understanding the World	Use all their senses in hands-on exploration of natural materials.	Adult to hide objects inside a box and describe to the child what it feels like. Can the children then do the same? Can they guess what it is?	Encourage loose parts play with natural materials. Can they describe what it looks like? Feels like? Children to make collections of natural materials to explore/talk about and describe. Use the story 'We're Going on a Bear Hunt' to explore the different terrains/textures/senses
	Explore collections of materials with similar and/or different properties.	Sorting activity with an adult - using a range of materials e.g. felt, foil, silk, aluminium can they discuss the properties of each item? Put all the waterproof items together. Put all the heavy items together etc.	Exploring materials and use them to make textured pictures
