



Children's Safeguarding Policy

Safeguarding means that staff will:

- Keep us safe when in school from any intruders or strangers
- Give us first aid if we are ill or injured
- Ensure that staff and children follow the school rules
- Help us to learn and know how to keep ourselves safe
- Help to solve problems if something goes wrong at home
- Set a good example by the way they behave in school

How do the staff at Bellfield protect you?

- They listen to us
- Sometimes they talk to our parents and sometimes give our parents help
- Give us all an equal chance to learn so we have a good future
- Help us to learn in a safe environment and know how to keep ourselves and others safe
- Help to keep the entrances and exits safe with Road Safety Officers
- We do Fire alarms to practise getting out of the building quickly and safely

What can you do if you are concerned?

- Talk to any staff member and tell them our worries
- Tell a friend and seek help from an adult with the support of your friend
- Speak to Mrs Anscombe or Mrs Lomax if you have any worries/concerns or are feeling unsafe
- Mrs Anscombe and Mrs Lomax might talk to your parents if you need extra help. Sometimes they might give your family help so that everyone feels safe
- Sometimes Mrs Anscombe has to speak to other agencies to get extra help for you and your family – this is okay, it will mean you get help so that you are safe.





Need to talk? Here is what you can do.

- Talk to a friend who you trust
- Talk to an adult who your trust
- Talk to Mrs Anscombe or Mrs Lomax and ask for help
