
Have a wonderful Easter. I hope you enjoy lots of family time together and of course eating as much chocolate as possible!

### At Bellfield Primary School we "Believe, Persevere, Succeed."

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On 4<sup>th</sup> May 1954 Bellfield Primary School opened its doors for the first time, making this year our 70<sup>th</sup> Birthday. WOW! The school has had many changes over the years and will continue to into the future. Who knows what they school will look like in another 30 years when it will turn 100!

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#### A brief overview of the history of Bellfield Primary School

**1954**: On 4th May Bellfield County Primary School was opened under the Headship of Miss H Suckling. 303 children aged between 5 and 11 years old were admitted to the school.

On the 30th November the school was officially "handed over". At the ceremony the Handing Over Speech was made by Alderman Schultz and the Acceptance Speech was given by Councillor Buckle.

**1955:** On 25th November, almost exactly one year after the handing over, two new classrooms were brought into use. This expansion was necessary because of the demand for places as a result of the Grasby Road area expansion.

**1968:** On 30th April Mrs B Hodgson took over the Headship on the retirement of Miss Suckling, after 14 years of Headship.

**1969:** As part of the reorganisation of Hull Schools into a 3-tier system, Bellfield Primary School changed to a 5 to 9 years old Primary School.

1984: During this year, one of the infant classrooms was adapted to become a 26 place nursery.

1987: Mrs R Taylor took over the Headship following the retirement of Mrs Hodgson.

**1988:** In September Hull schools were reorganised once again into a 2-tier system. Bellfield took on its present status of Primary School with 236 places for 5 to 11 years old and a 26 place Nursery.

1997: Mrs Taylor retired at Easter and Mr M Williamson was appointed Acting Head Teacher.

Mrs M Murray was appointed to the Headship from September 1997.

2001: The first phase of the children's play area was completed with outdoor climbing equipment and seating.

2004: Bellfield celebrated its Golden Jubilee with special events for the pupils and families.

All pupils received a mug or money box and a rosette as a memento from the Friends of Bellfield.

**2005**: A Jubilee Woodland Walk and Fitness trail were opened. It was designed by the children with the help of a landscape architect and implemented with the support of Ann Rayner and the Yorkshire Wildlife Trust.


**2006**: The building was extended again to improve staff accommodation with an extension to the Head's room and staffroom, new staff toilets, a new disabled toilet, two new stores and a PE store.

2009: Mrs M Murray retired in July, after 12 years.

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**2013:** Bellfield became one the of founding schools of Hull Collaborative Academy Trust, along with Collingwood, Eastfield, Thoresby and Wansbeck Primary Schools.

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2014: The school celebrated its Ruby Jubilee, turning 60 years old. Celebrations included a special lunch, come dressed in 1950's clothes and a party afternoon for the children.

2017: Mrs C Mudd left Bellfield to take up the Headship at Wheeler Primary School.

Mr S Mills was appointed Head of School, with Mr M Batty as Executive Head Teacher of Bellfield.

2018: Mr S Mills was appointed as substantive Head Teacher and Mr M Batty continued to support other schools within the Trust.

**2020**: Covid hit the world and like many schools, Bellfield had to close its doors to the majority of pupils. Only key worker children remained being educated on the school site, with everyone else taking up home learning. (20<sup>th</sup> March 2020 was the final day for all pupils before we closed our doors) Key worker children joined a local Trust Hub at Longhill Primary School, being educated by Bellfield staff until June, when we reopened our doors to more children. In June we welcomed 1/3 of our pupils back to school for the final month of the year.

April 20<sup>th</sup> Mr S Mills left Bellfield to take up the Headship at Dorchester Primary School.

April 20th Miss A Howard appointed as Head of School and Mr M Batty reprised his position as Executive Head Teacher

**2020 (September)**: We welcomed all children back to school after the first wave of Covid. It was lovely to see everyone after we had been apart for 5 months.

2024: We are now celebrating our Platinum Jubilee (70 years).

#### **CELEBRATION ACTIVITES**

Thank you to everyone who voted for a Bellfield Birthday Family event – the winning idea was a family picnic. We will therefore be having a family picnic on Monday 20<sup>th</sup> May at 3pm – 5.30pm on the school field. We will dismiss children at 3pm that day and you can go straight onto the school field, pick a spot and set up your picnic area. (Blankets/ picnic tables/ chairs – however you wish to enjoy your picnic.) There will be games/sporting equipment out so that everyone can enjoy themselves. We are also hoping to arrange for an ice-cream van to visit the site so if you wish to buy ice-creams for yourselves this will be available.

The children will be having a special week of celebrations on their return to school after the May half term (Wednesday 5<sup>th</sup> June – Friday 7<sup>th</sup> June will be the celebration week). Each year group will be looking at a period of time from 1954 – 2024, learning about the different decades as part of our celebrations. On Friday 7<sup>th</sup> June we are asking that children come dressed in clothes from their given period of time. (See below for each year group period of time)

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There will be three competitions running throughout the month of May (all entries need to be handed in by Friday 24<sup>th</sup> May – ready to be judged and winners announced during our celebration week.)

- 2) Write a newspaper article about Bellfield Primary School
- 3) Design a Platinum Jubilee 70<sup>th</sup> Birthday Cake
